Our church seems to be bursting with talent these days, and there is more coming down the pike.

Our Maine Character Series, for example, got off to a great start on Saturday, Mar. 28, with the one-act play, "The Parmachene Belle." Written and performed in our sanctuary by Portland's Carolyn Gage, the drama was set in the year 1899. It captured an intriguing episode in the life of an authentic "Maine Character," the nationally known fishing guide, "Fly Rod" Crosby – who was a woman.

The crux of the play is her relationship with another very determined pioneer in a 100% male world – the sharpshooter Annie Oakley. About 60 people enjoyed the show and the "talk-back" with the playwright afterwards.

The next "Maine Character" event will be April 25, and will feature the social activist and poet, Gary Lawless. Lawless, known for giving voice to groups and individuals often overlooked in our society, will lead a special workshop on "finding your poetic voice" on Saturday afternoon in the Parish Hall, and then give a reading Saturday night in the sanctuary.

There are details elsewhere in this issue of "The Messenger." Don't miss this unusual opportunity.

Homegrown dramatic arts will also get an opportunity on April 26, with the reader's theater group, "Seniors Acting Up." This experienced group will give a matinee performance from 3 – 6 PM on that Sunday afternoon, bringing play excerpts to life for young and old alike. Details are elsewhere in "The Messenger."

In May, our Fund Raising and Music committees are reviving a long-time church tradition with a Church Talent Show. I do mean long-time – did you know there was a shallow stage built into the north wall of the Parish Hall? It's true. On the wall of the Green Room is a picture of one of the hundreds of shows that were performed there up until the 1960s, when the stage was finally removed.

In any event, if you have singing talent or a flair for comedy – or both – this is your big break! It's such a big break that all levels of talent are welcome (we are a UU church). Sign up on or before May 10 to get in on the fun, which will happen – complete with a pot luck dinner – on Saturday, May 23. Yes, there will be a stage.

Again, details are elsewhere in "The Messenger." You are also welcome to talk to Tom M. or Ellie R. to get the whole scoop.

Have I mentioned you'll find details about these activities in "The Messenger"?

You will also find our monthly calendar, how to become a member, a financial report, updates from DRE Carol Larson and whatever I happen to be thinking about when the Packet deadline looms. You will find sermon topics and other Sunday service information for the month, a ton of other news and notes and many invitations to participate in the diverse activities of this exceptionally active church community.

Of course all this will take a few minutes to read. But the effort is well worth it. There are great folks here. They're talented, too.

RE-flections

As you all may have noticed, the number of young people attending our religious exploration classes each week has grown steadily this year. A number of families with small children have been attending regularly. This has allowed us to add a pre-K/K class which occurs in the nursery each week. Our Spirit Play class includes children from Grades 1-3. And I teach a class for grades 4-8 (and sometimes 9). One Sunday a month I take the Grades 1- 8 groups to give the teachers a break and to provide some all-together time.

Our available teacher pool has not kept pace with our growth in numbers. In order to have a viable RE program each week we need 3-4 teachers for each class. This allows for continuity without asking one or two people to give up their worship time every week. We also need volunteers to serve as class assistants, just to lend a hand to the teacher and to be the back up required to comply with our safety policy of two adults with each group. In recent weeks there have been more weeks than not that there was no extra adult. There have also been weeks when no one was available in the nursery to assist with the little children. Our teachers are tired. I am tired. And we need your help.

Many of our families include two or more children. While they may be willing to help with teaching, the critical mass of parents is too small to make our program work without volunteers who have no children in the program. We also have difficulty pinning people down to a specific week, which means time is wasted weekly trying to figure out who is teaching or covering the nursery.

The RE Committee and I are determined to improve this staffing situation in the coming year. We have designated Sunday, April 19 as teacher recruitment Sunday. On that Sunday we will be asking all of you to consider volunteering to help us with staffing in the coming year. Please consider how important it is to the long term health of this congregation to recruit and nurture new families and children. Your gift of one Sunday a month to teach or even a couple of Sundays a year in the nursery will greatly enhance our ability to provide a quality RE experience for our young people.

I do want to thank all the teachers who have pitched in and done more than their share this year. And I also want to say how grateful I am to those who have stepped forward to help with specific tasks when asked. We have terrific young people in this church. You are giving an invaluable gift to them. Thank you all.

Help for Hunger” to Assist Food Pantry

“Help for Hunger” is our UUCSB initiative to sustain the Saco Food Pantry. In 2008, the Food Pantry served 2,822 families in Saco, and some from Old Orchard Beach and Biddeford. The Food Pantry tries to provide 4 days worth of meals for a family of four each month, but the need for this assistance is growing rapidly.

Many people donated during the holiday season, but the need for help goes on throughout the year. We hope “Help for Hunger” campaign can restock the Food Pantry on a regular basis.

Please consider buying non-perishable food items for the Food Pantry when you shop. Staples are especially welcome, such as canned tuna, peanut butter, tomato sauce and dry cereal. Please leave them in the basket outside the Parish Hall door.

Our “Pantry Sunday” will be every fourth Sunday of the month, beginning Sunday, Apr. 26 . We want to collect as much as possible on that Sunday so our Social Concerns Committee can deliver to the Pantry the following week. The last week of the month is when people are most likely to run short of food.

You are also invited to donate cash which will be used by the Food Pantry to buy what is needed in any given week. Checks should be made out to UUCSB with "Pantry" marked on the subject line. Thank you for your generosity.
