March 4

Invisible Rev. Jeff Logan

Pastor Jeff Logan works as a homeless outreach minister with Grace-Street Ministry. He spends several hours a week in direct, face-to-face contact with the homeless population of Portland, both in the various day and overnight shelters, and also on the streets. This group of people is often painted with a broad brush that focuses on disruptive behavior, substance abuse and mental illness. The purpose of this sermon is to introduce you to some of the individuals in this community, and to show the triumphs and failures, joys and sorrows, regrets and resolve that are no different than those experienced by the people in any other community in Maine.

A common question in the shelter is "where's your church?" And we just gesture around the shelter and say, "our church is here".

March 11

March 18

Greater Portland Family Promise Carol Larson

Greater Portland Family Promise is an inter-faith response to homelessness in Portland. Thirteen host faith communities and many support communities are providing temporary housing for up to four families with children while they work to obtain permanent housing. Since its inception in July of 2017, Family Promise has supported twelve families and found permanent homes for five. The program maintains a day center at the Portland YMCA where families go during the day for services. In the evening they are transported to the host community of the week for food, conversation, and overnight accommodation. Carol Larson and Carol Jenkins, host coordinators at Allen Avenue UU will speak about their experience hosting families and about opportunities for Saco/Biddeford to become involved.

Along the Way

On the Sundays of January 21 in Sanford and January 28 in Saco, I invited those in church that day to jot down questions for my consideration: "Questions of the Spirit" I called them. Two or three I addressed extempore that morning in place of the usual sermon. I promised that I would share with you all of the questions I received and so here they are.

This is an exercise many ministers like to do once a year or so, some by having a "Question Box" to which members can submit for a week or so in advance, while others, such as I, relish the opportunity to respond "on my feet" to some questions while saving others for later sermon or discussion topics.

I find this "respond in the moment" approach refreshing as a change of pace from the very prepared sermon, supported with readings and hymns, that is our usual practice. Moreover, as you will see, the questions I receive are always thoughtful, stimulating and show the range of thought typical of a UU church. Some will certainly find their way into future sermons and discussions.

I thank all who responded on those days, and I invite other such questions at any time (no need to wait for "Questions of the Spirit" Sunday.) However, rather than a quick conversation at coffee hour, which I might not retain in all of the busyness of the morning, the best way to do that is by e-mail. I look forward to it.

How do we build faith or find a creed as well as be open to other aspects of God, other aspects of our unconscious or subconscious we may have denied but need to be whole and to align ourselves as people and with God?

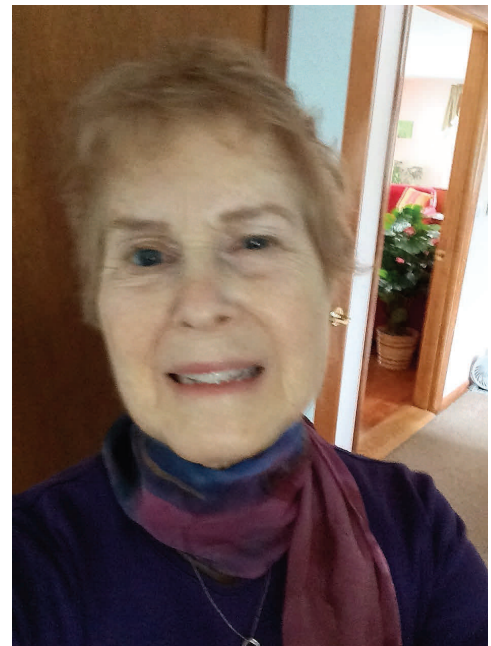
4) Other music experiences: I haven't played an instrument since I was 12-20 or so...piano

FiAT – Faith in Action Team – will have its monthly meeting on Sunday, March 11th, at 11:15 in the parlor. All are welcome.

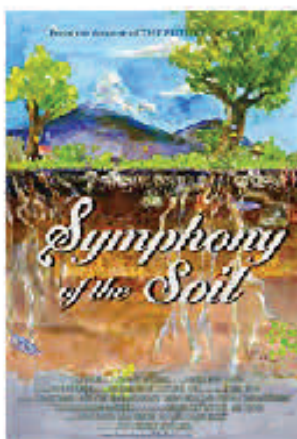
Share the Plate for March will be collected on March 18th.

Notes from your Ministerial Search Committee

Your Search Committee is Energized!! All our work to bring us the very best ministerial candidate is paying off! Out of sixteen interested in us, we have selected four possible candidates for our next minister. All members of the committee are excited - really excited - about each one of them after reading their ministerial records, interviewing them, and talking with named references.

Now it's time to meet them. Between now and the end of March we will spend a weekend with each candidate, getting comfortable with one another, interviewing each other in depth, touring them in our churches and around our communities, and observing them as they lead services in neutral pulpits. So don't be surprised to find us absent on Sundays; and if you should happen to be in the church when we are touring or see us out together in the community, please don't ask us to introduce the candidate to you. All is confidential - for now.

We will finish our neutral pulpit weekends just in time to make a decision, and this may be a challenging one to make, given the quality of each candidate. Offers from all UUA congregations searching for ministers go out at the same time at the end of March - good news for candidates who may receive more than one offer, nail-biting time for us as we wait for a "Yes!"

At that point we will finalize plans to bring our candidate to UUCSB and SUUC for a full week, including two Sundays. You will have multiple opportunities to meet and talk with the candidate and to experience two Sunday services before a congregational vote to call our next minister.

We welcome any questions you have as we meet and interview our pre-candidates - what you think we should know about them and what hopes or concerns that you have.
