Along the Way

Most ministers are indefatigable gleaners of wisdom in the form of quotes; we collect so many we may no longer know just exactly when and where we might have found one we like. Such is the case with this from Chet Raymo: "We live in a world that is deep beyond our knowing, and profoundly worthy of our reverence and awe."

Chet Raymo is a well-published author, educator and naturalist who holds the title of Professor Emeritus of Physics at Stonehill College in Easton, MA. His weekly newspaper column, Science Musings, appeared in the Boston Globe for twenty years. (If you want to catch up on his current thinking, log on to blog.scienceamusings.com.)

I don't know from which one of his many columns or books that quote may have come, or when, yet it really doesn't matter, as the wisdom he shares is timeless and cross-cultural. The ultimate unknowability of the universe is an insight discovered time and again by mystics, thinkers and scientists throughout the history of human thought.

By this I believe he means not that we cannot know anything about the world, for clearly we do and in increasingly deep and sophisticated ways. Not only the theories of modern physics and cosmogony, for example,

but the facts themselves upon which the theories are based are far in advance of anything known by the ancients, and for that matter, greatly in advance of what was known even a century ago. One can assume that, a century hence, yet even more facts will be known and verified. Point to almost any field of human inquiry and you can probably say the same.

What I think Raymo means, and if so I agree with him, is that the universe seems to have at its core an irreducible quality of unpredictability, an open-endedness, a multi-valence, that resists successfully all of our efforts to define, quantify and "factify" the world to its final degree. (I just made that one up—I'll define "factify" as the effort to reduce some aspect of the unknown to a scientifically verifiable fact.) Try as we might, with any googlebytes of computing power we might bring to it, the world at its core seems "unfactifiable" and unpredictable. I think this unpredictability is at the very heart of life and is, in fact, what allows for life itself to exist, change and evolve. Call it random chance, if you want, Grace, generosity of the Spirit of Life or whatever—poets, thinkers, mystics and scientists have variously labeled it over the centuries—it does render the world, I believe, deep beyond knowing. I would have to say that I, joining Chet Raymo, am profoundly thankful, reverent, and awestruck.

UUCSB - City of Saco Land Agreement

Exactly 190 years to the day after the City of Saco agreed to let the Second Parish Unitarian Church have use of the land between Tucker's fence and Thornton Academy; City Manager, Kevin Sutherland and City Planner, Bob Hamblen met with Mark Young, Betsey Pace and Anne Dobson to sign the agreement passed at the City Council meeting on Nov. 20.

Of course, Tucker's fence and the Thornton Academy mentioned in the 1827 document are long gone. So this agreement uses the plot of land that the UUCSB members voted on in Sept. 2016 as the dimensions of the property. The agreement further states that the UUCSB has use of this property for as long as they wish. And as stated in the original agreement, should the UUCSB no longer use the property, it will revert to the City.

All improvements to the property would revert to the City should we vacate. Any work done on the property would have to be in keeping with City ordinances and would revert to the City should we vacate. The UUCSB must maintain its current level of liability insurance. Should we build a parking area; we would agree to share it the Oasis Club across School Street.

Roderick Potter, Esq. helped us understand the legal terms and meanings of this agreement. He has offered to answer any questions we have on-going about this issue.

Without the efforts of Eric B. Cote, then Ward 6 City Councilor, this agreement would not have happened. This agreement passed at Mr. Cote's last council meeting. We thank him for his support, title search and guidance and perseverance. We wish him well in his retirement from City government.

Now we must start planning for the up keep and the improvements to our property.
