Shay's Musings

It's Spring!

Well...kind of.

I'm writing this from our sunroom, where, with a small space heater, it's finally warm enough to sit again. It's the Spring Equinox, a balanced day of light and night, and I'm watching a super moon rise in the dusky sky.

I've been reading *The Island Within* by Richard Nelson – a beautiful book filled with lyrical prose and spiritual depth as he realizes over and over again that the breadth and depth of Nature is something to be respected, experienced, protected, and revered.

"Throughout this vast expanse the land breathes with song and pours an anthem of morning into the sky. In the glow of a summer sunrise, the living continent sings."

The world is reawakening, however slowly, blooming and blossoming everywhere around us. Look closely and you will see the signs.

For many of us, I imagine the world within is reawakening as well, after a long, gray winter. When I first came here in August and had grand visions of all the things we would get done, people warned me that life slows down in the winter months. Now I know this to be true!

And it's time for us to move out of hibernation. There is work to be done in this beautiful, brilliant world – songs to be heard and songs to be sung.

"It matters not what the clocks say or the attitudes and labors of men. Morning is when I am awake and there is a dawn in me. Moral reform is the effort to throw off sleep...to be awake is to be alive. We must learn to reawaken and keep ourselves awake, not by mechanical aids, but by an infinite expectation of the dawn, which does not forsake us in our soundest sleep. I know of no more encouraging fact than the unquestionable ability of man to elevate his life by a conscious endeavor. It is something to be able to paint a particular picture, or to carve a statue, and so to make a few objects beautiful; but it is far more glorious to carve and paint the very atmosphere and medium through which we look, which morally we can do. To affect the quality of the day, that is the highest of arts. Every man is tasked to make his life, even in its details, worthy of the contemplation of his most elevated and critical hour. If we refused, or rather used up, such paltry information as we get, the oracles would distinctly inform us how this might be done." ~ Henry David Thoreau from Walden

My friends, let there be a dawn in you! Throw off sleep and jump willingly into the unfamiliar and the unknown. Affect the quality of your days with wonder and awe through conscious endeavor. Carve and paint yourselves anew into a wakefulness that sees this world the way we dream it to be – a wakefulness that inspires you to work toward creating that world unfailingly.

Faith in Action Team: UUCSB's Social Justice Center

How Social Justice Work Builds Spiritual Muscle, One Brake Cable at a Time (by Randa)

My work with the refugee family I support has brought me again, face to face with the question of how much is enough. This is a question we all face regularly and one with which I'm very familiar.

Lacking other reliable, convenient transportation, the family has been using their bikes to get around. Hearing about some of the times and places they have ridden their bikes, I became alarmed, worried about safety of these people I love. On a day I was feeling particularly depleted from a hard day at my job, the little one told me her brakes had failed that week and she hadn't been able stop her bike. What!?! I immediately went to her bike and was able to make a small adjustment to her brakes that would slow her down for a while. I didn't have time or energy to check the other bikes.

Worry over the situation left me feeling even more exhausted than I had felt upon my arrival at their home that day. At the bottom of my energy stores, I started to write to Rev Shay about it. The situation returned me to the spiritual question about the limits of my power. The approach that usually helps me is to think of the biggest picture and work back down. So many needs in the world...Poor people in Maine...Refugees in Biddeford...This refugee family...That single issue with that one bike. Is that enough?

For the moment, I came to my own resolution to that question. More will come up, including even the same one, and I will tackle it again. Thus is the nature of the human experience.

Bike riders and hikers enjoy a beautiful journey from South Portland to the Piscataqua River in Kittery. Our gifts will help the ETA with their current fund drive to close a critical 1.6-mile gap between South Portland and Scarborough.

Capital Campaign - What's Up? April, 2019

Re-doing the front steps to the Sanctuary four years ago was the catalyst for a Capital Campaign. If you're a new member or friend, you may ask, What is the Capital Campaign? As a current member, you may say, Capital Campaign? I don't see anything happening... This time intensive process has a bit of history....

At the Annual Meeting in June, 2016, B & G presented an assessment of UUCSB's needs done by Roger Panek an historic architect. Based on this assessment, we listed priorities and a wish list, created and mailed a flyer listing major projects, and requested initial financial support/pledges. A partial project list includes: Stabilizing the Parish Hall underpinnings, Restoring/repairing the Organ, Installing a new heating system, Restoring the Sanctuary windows, Re-doing the central entrance area, and Replacing the cupola on the Sanctuary roof. A unanimous vote was passed to proceed with a Capital Campaign, with a goal \$350,000.



The Capital Campaign Committee adopted a process developed by Sacred Places, an organization that helps churches embark on Capital Campaigns. We have completed three of the

five parts- Public Value, Heritage (see the timeline on the Parish Hall Bulletin Board, and a Building Assessment. The fourth part, Discovering our Community Partners & Resources is not yet complete. We can NOT ask potential community sponsors until we have roughly 90% support from our church members AND have raised \$130,000. The fifth part, Telling our Story, is where we sell our story to our potential partners/sponsors (once we have the 90% and \$130,000).

We also have a grant-writing team, which hopes to bring in \$90,000-\$100,000 as part of our fundraising.

To date we have repaired the foundation in the Sanctuary underneath where the choir sits, re-pointed the Parish Hall chimney, restored half of the Parish Hall windows, replaced one window in the RE room (funded from other donations), replaced the roof over the chancel, and restored the fan window and louvers over the front entrance of the Sanctuary. These repairs were noted in Roger Panek's report, and were completed using the Capital Campaign funds.

Currently, we are in conversation with a Project Manager to get permits and quotes for under-the-Parish-Hall-Cleanout, shoring up the foundation, and replacing the skirting. Work will begin in late Spring/early Summer.

The good news is that Roger Panek noted in his report that for the age of our building we're in pretty good shape. As we each take care of our own homes and make repairs as needed, we need, also, to take care of our church building and make repairs that are necessary.

Financial note: Approximately 50% of our members have pledged a total of \$75,765 to date. Available pledge cash (in a savings account) is \$56,601.70.








Conflict Resolution Process

The Unitarian Universalist Church of Saco and Biddeford is committed to fostering right relations among its members, friends, and staff.

We understand that conflict can be an inevitable part of a healthy community and can serve as an opportunity for growth and development. As members of this congregation, it is incumbent on all of us to handle conflict in ways that are reflected in our covenant.

You are welcome to speak informally with any member of the Committee on Ministries. We are easily identified by our yellow nametags.

Please read the Conflict Brochure developed by this committee and follow the Conflict Resolution Pathway that applies to your situation. When needed, the CoM will assist in developing a mediation plan for all involved parties.

Keep in mind that the CoM doesn't handle anonymous input. Be assured that information communicated will be handled with appropriate confidentiality.








Our Membership:
