



# **Shay's Musings**

*Imago Dei* – the assertion that human beings are created in the image and likeness of God. This core belief, instilled into the very depths of my being by the three spiritual traditions that have formed me, is the container which holds all I believe about divinity and humanity and the interconnection between them. As C.S. Lewis says, we are all "possible gods and goddesses… All day long we are, in some degree, helping each other to this destination… There are no ordinary people."

There are no ordinary people. Each of us is created in the image of something Divine. Most of us have forgotten this fact; or it has been buried under the effects of trauma or neglect; or obscured by fear and grief. When we lose our awareness of the divine within, and our connection to the divine in others, there is suffering, grief, anxiety, loneliness. My job, as I understand it, first and foremost, is reminding, affirming, and guiding people back into the fullness of their own divinity and their connection to all beings and to the Holy/Love/Nature/Mystery.

As we launch into exploring Universalism more deeply this month, let us remember all we have learned from the Myth of the Shattering of the Vessels (Judaism) in which we are tasked with recovering all the shards of divine light that have been scattered throughout the Universe, and the belief from Hinduism that Brahman dwells within everyone and everything. During this month of remembering those we have lost, and giving gratitude for all that we have, I ask you to open your hearts to seeing the "worth-ship" of everyone you meet.

cal devastation and the nation's distorted morality."

The Poor People's Campaign states: "We demand the implementation of our Moral Agenda and call all people of conscience to engage in deeply moral civic engagement and voting that cares about poor and low-wealth people, the sick, immigrants, workers, the environment, people with disabilities, the LGBTQ community, and peace over war.

Jeannine W. will work with Rev. Shay to determine the best month to feature each recipient. Please contact them with your "nominee".



#### **Conflict Resolution Process**

The Unitarian Universalist Church of Saco and Biddeford is committed to fostering right relations among its members, friends, and staff.

We understand that conflict can be an inevitable part of a healthy community and can serve as an opportunity for growth and development. As members of this congregation, it is incumbent on all of us to handle conflict in ways that are reflected in our covenant.

You are welcome to speak informally with any member of the Committee on Ministries. We are easily identified by our yellow nametags

Please read the Conflict Brochure developed by this committee and follow the Conflict Resolution Pathway that applies to your situation. When needed, the CoM will assist in developing a mediation plan for all involved parties.

Keep in mind that the CoM doesn't handle anonymous input. Be assured that information communicated will be handled with appropriate confidentiality.

## **UUCSB Recycling Tips**

If you are a resident of Saco, you probably recently received a big post card from the City about transfer station usage and recycling tips. This is very useful information.

We at the UUCSB try to keep good recycling practices in mind and in use. In this effort, we have posted recycling guides by containers in the kitchen, green room and supply closet.




