Biographies

Reverend Todd Glacy, MA, is an Enlightenment Advocate, Spiritual Explorer and Instigator of Joy. As a speaker, musician, workshop facilitator and Interfaith Minister he traveled extensively sharing his passion and expertise for empowering people to relax and reconnect with their most authentic selves in order to live lives of purpose, passion, and true happiness.

Todd holds a Bachelor's Degree from Berklee College of Music in Boston and a Master's Degree in Counseling from USM, After working for a decade as a School Counselor, he enrolled in an intensive two year program at the Chaplaincy Institute of Maine (ChIME) where he received his ordination as an Interfaith Minister. He is a certified life coach, yoga instructor, drum circle facilitator and the creator of the Gong JourneyworkTM Wisdoming process. He has recorded a number CD's and even served as audio engineer for His Holiness the Dali Llama. He loves hiking, camping and most any outdoor activity, and counts himself among the fortunate few people to have been struck by lightening and actually lived to tell about it!

Reverend Niki Norman is a graduate of ChIME - the Chaplaincy Institute of Maine, and was ordained by ChIME in 2020. Also a member of the UUCSB, Rev Niki is very grateful for the love and support from the the UUCSB congregation.

Reverend Myra Robinson, ordained by the Chaplaincy Institute of Maine (ChIME) in 2016 and has been serving her community in large and small ways ever since; from respite caregiving/ singing to those at end-of-life, to being Minister-of-the-Week at Ferry Beach Conference Center.

As a mentor to incarcerated women upon their release — through her work with My Sisters Keeper — she received a Volunteer Appreciation Award at the Cumberland County Jail in 2017. Rev. Myra's personal Mission Statement is "to be a channel for Grace and to make a difference." She currently offers guest clergy services in local churches, as well as pastoral care and bereavement support as needed. Upon request she officiates weddings, memorials, and rituals; but mostly, her ministry of music and mindfulness has led her to develop and market her AffirmantraTM Workshops which she enjoys presenting in-person and online. She lives in Scarbororugh with her spouse and two naughty cats.

Reverend Lori Whittemore is an ordained interfaith chaplain and community minister. She received a Master of Divinity from Bangor Theological Seminary in 2010 and was ordained by Chaplaincy Institute of Maine in 2014. She has served as a chaplain in hospice and the American Red Cross. Rev. Whittemore was the founder of Abbey of Hope, an interfaith cooperation circle and also developed and directs a clinical pastoral training program that provides professional training and field experience for chaplains and lay folk of varying traditions and settings with the modern religious and spiritual landscape in mind. She helped create the Spiritual Care Corps for Maine CDC Emergency Response during COVID. Lori founded Spiritual Care Services of Maine (SCS Maine), a contracting organization created to match professional, compassionate per diem chaplain and spiritual care services.

What's Going on at Building and Grounds?

Windows, windows, windows. You have heard from us about Matt's work on the parish hall windows, which is a Capital Campaign funded project as are the Sanctuary windows. Jane Perkins is project manager for the Sanctuary work and Paul Glynn is assisting. As I recall we have reported that as well.

A much smaller project is the redoing of the windows upstairs in the Annex. That all started with a BB gun and someone who could not resist aiming (successfully) at one of these windows. We discovered the cracked window one day early last spring. The wonders of duct tape kept the pane in place until we could get the frame out and to Dupuis for a replacement. While new glass was being put in we inspected the other three up stairs windows and discovered that the frames were rife with mold and in poor shape. Over the passed three months the mold has been abated, minor repairs have been made and new paint has been applied. Should be good for another few years.

Our projects for the winter months are mostly painting - the Green Room, the Brides Room, the stairway to the second floor and the upstairs hall. We NEED HELP! See Jane Perkins or Anne Dobson for details.

We have been expecting an estimate on our roof leaks in the Sanctuary and in the Parish Hall for some time now. Hope to have these estimates this week.

Our present fun project is consideration of what to do with our newly discovered steeple finial. B&G folks are having preliminary on line discussions about recommendations at this very moment. Here's the background: Mark Gotjen found this pole under the Parish Hall this summer. He has it at his workshop. We would like to get this cleaned up and displayed in or around our church.
