Merge, converge, consolidate, integrate, unify, amplify.

The title for this week's service is a little misleading. The end of October marks the anniversary of Unitarian and Universalist merger, although it was called by many other names. From the different accounts of merging nationally and locally, merge doesn't really reflect the decisions and process of the joining of the Universalist and Unitarian traditions into one new expression. However finding a true name was and is still hard. Sometimes language can be very confining. Sometimes the magnitude of changes or obstacles seem overwhelming. So I invite you to spend time with the word "yet". We are always becoming. We integrate each new moment with all that is gone before and map paths forward using all of experience we bring to interpret new data coming in.
