Good Morning Good People

The end of Novemberr is approaching. Some say this time of year represents the thin veil of reality. When we are closest to the totality of things both living and dead. The dark time begs a slowing down, a quieting, a period of observation, a time of letting go. This Sunday we will join together in ritual. We will light candles for life, death, love and divine spirit. We will remember those we have lost this past year, and the hard times and broken situations that no longer serve us. We will create a Samhain alter together by placing fall offerings and lighting candles for that which we want to let go of. If you are joining us from home, please have a candle ready to join in our ritual.

I offer you this as a meditation for today. Find some place quiet to sit. I invite you to do some quiet, attentive breathing. Once you are settled, read these questions, let them rest in your consciousness and journal about them if you feel called to do so.

LIFE: What does the idea of life mean to me in this momen?. How am I cultivating a rich, robust existence for myself? What do I need to let go of to fully live into the gift of this one precious life? DEATH: Who have I lost? Literally or figuratively? What does death mean to me right now? With the veil thinned, what can I let cross over so that I may prepare myself for preparing myself for the new year LOVE: Where and how is love present in my life? How does it sustain me? Where am I called to love and to love more?

DIVINE SPIRIT: What does this mean to me? Where do I feel it in this moment? How will I let it abide and guide me into and through this dark time?

### Five Ways to Cultivate Courage

Some folks asked for me to share the 5 ways of cultivating courage so I am sharing them from my service

1. **Make fear your friend**. You will never be completely without fear, so when you feel fear ask it what it has to tell you. Treat it like a friend or companion with useful information to share.

- 2. **Embrace courage as a mindful response to fear.** Responding thoughtfully to fear will build courage. Rather than giving into anxiety of the unknown, know that you have the capacity to respond in a helpful way.
- 3. **Choose to be bold by simply committing to action**. You don't even have to have an answer or the answer. Commit to be a part of the solution and you will step into your future courageously
- 4. **Be vulnerable.** Sharing your fears and anxieties in community will remind you that you are not alone and that there is strength in numbers
- 5. **Do it for others**. Nothing cultivates courage like standing up for and with others in the face of difficult times.

#### Share the Plate - October

This month's plate offering will be split with the National Resources Council of Maine. Acting boldly on climate change has become deeply entwined with Maine's identity - whether it's coastal communities planning for sea-level rise or homeowners embracing heat pumps as a way to lower pollution and lower energy costs.
