Thoughts from Rev. Lori

Hello Good People,

Ending the week after the holiday feels to me like I lived a short week. I hope that the return of the sun and the summer temperatures are helping your spirits as much as mine. I picked up some books from the yard sale. (along with a crafted turkey decoration that is absolutely fabulous) The books are about constructing theology within a tradition that feels light on theology. It might seem dry or heady, but we could use some of our summertime to think about what theology means to us personally. "theology is a study of thought and analysis that discusses religious truth and has to do with ultimate concern and commitment to that truth" (Gilbert, Introduction to Building Your Own Theology) The beauty of our community and our faith tradition, is that these truths are not spelled out. Your theology requires that you engage the principles in your lives and in this community in ways that reflect your ultimate concern. Demonstrating to yourself and the world what really moves you. We are encouraged to create our own core meanings, values and convictions and continuously evaluate them as we move through life. How wonderful AND how daunting. If you want to think about your own theology as you meander into summer, let me invite you to think about or journal about the basics:

- 1. how do you name or understand God, or ultimate reality? Is it nature, or beauty, or love? Is it Jesus or Allah or Adonai?
- 2. how do you interact with that ultimate reality? Do you pray or sing or walk in nature or something else?
- 3. in what forum do you live out this relationship and become accountable for your beliefs? Do you go to church, or AA? Do you practice Yoga with others?
- 4. What does missing the mark mean to you or look like for you?
- 5. What does making amends look like for you?
- 6. What does grace mean in your belief system and where is it present for you?

7. Based on all of these things, what is your vocation or call-in service of your beliefs?

These are components of a theological belief system. It is important to recognize that what you believe today or even in this moment will be different than you believe tomorrow or in the next moment. Whatever you believe in now and engage in decisions in the moment will change you and therefore how you navigate these questions. I invite you to think about these for yourself and write them out.
