• Thoughts from Rev. Lori

Dear soggy friends,

Well, here we are again! Drenched and pruned! I hope you are enjoying the lushness of the grasses and foliage. At least we have that to hold on to. I just finished my first banned book. Barbara Kingsolver's *Demon Copperhead*. I actually picked it as a fun read while in Costa Rica. It was a great book! And it touched some deeply troubling issues for us as a society. Racism, classism, abuse, abject poverty, the child welfare system, the opioid crisis, and the strain and access to recovery programs to name some of the obvious ones. Issues that are deeply troubling and need exploration on many levels and from many directions. Art/literature being one of them. So let us resolve to do our summer reading of banned book (s). Looking forward to our discussion about Girls Like Me. It is a fiction book but highlights some troubling topics. Which it is why it is banned. If you encounter or enjoy another banned book, feel free to tell us about it this on a Sunday. It appears that our times together this summer may be freeform and that is okay too.

This weekend our Muslim friends will roll out the carpets. Literally. Let us hold in our hearts wishes for a rich time for them during their celebration of Ashura. Days of sadness to mourn an important figure in their religion. I feel it is a good thing to have our families and religious traditions teach us how to mourn, rather than hide it or overlook it. Group mourning is a release valve for ourselves and our communities. Built up sadness is never good. It transforms into many things.

So, it begs the question, how do UU's collectively mourn? Or do we? What would it look like in practice or theology? Should we create or incorporate formal community mourning in ways that help us reflect and let go of hard times as a community? Perhaps this fall we can have a day or week of mourning

to mark and let go of the plague of COVID and its devastating effects on our society and community. Food for thought.

In solidarity with our guests, I invite you to bring to mind the idea of mourning for yourself, your family, and this community. What does that look like in your life personally? Do you have rituals or practices that allow grief to move through you and beyond? Do you deny grief, ignore it, or hold it in? Is that helpful? Spend some time thinking about grief. Perhaps that will make interesting conversation for the next few weeks while we host our mourners!
