### Thoughts from Rev. Lori

Honoring Indigenous Peoples' Day

This week we will honor Indigenous people in a few ways. Our service is crafted from UUA resources about Indigenous People's Day. We have invited Wabanki Public Health and Wellness to share about their work for the native people in Maine. I share with you words from a NPR story when President Biden declared October 10. 2022 to be Indigenous People's Day.

Indigenous Peoples' Day advocates say the recognition helps correct a "whitewashed" American history that has glorified Europeans like Italian explorer Christopher Columbus who have committed violence against Indigenous communities. Native Americans have long criticized the inaccuracies and harmful narratives of Columbus' legacy that credited him with his "discovery" of the Americas when Indigenous people were there first.

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We benefit from the structural racism that started when first explorer set foot on this soil and proclaimed the land for their sovereign. While we don't believe ourselves individually to be racist, every institution and most organizations are organized around colonized principles. Roberts Rules of Order is a hierarchical system that was designed as a Parliamentary practice for England adopted by those colonists organizing the colonies. It can be a great way to create and preserve order and it can be a way of governing that minimizes collaboration and suppresses voices that don't speak our language or understand our governing structure. Literally or figuratively. I invite us to

reflect on how we do Church. Who is not here can be as much about how we run the institution as what we are about.

- Read this again
- Meditate, see if one word or concept stands out for you
- Reflect on that that word or concept informs your life and belief system
- Contemplate take this with you today and through the weekend until we gather on Sunday

WABANAKI HEALING & RECOVERY: Addressing the treatment and recovery needs in our communities, we opened doors to multiple locations to support tribal members on their recovery journey.

WABANAKI PUBLIC HEALTH: We provide public health services including nutrition and physical education, environmental health, youth engagement, a women's economic hub, injury and violence prevention, maternal and child health, culture, education and language, infectious disease, and community wellness.

WABANAKI HEALTH & WELLNESS: Our mission is to provide high-quality, culturally relevant behavioral health services, substance use treatment, and housing support services to our Wabanaki community and other Indigenous people.

CENTER FOR WABANAKI RESEARCH, KNOWLEDGE & INNOVATION: The mission of the Center for Wabanaki Research, Knowledge & Innovation is to create a world where Wabanaki people overcome barriers to improve health and wellness in our communities empowered by Wabanaki-led data and research. In September, we will be sharing our plate collection with the MDF. Half of the plate offering for the month will be earmarked for this fund.
