The Board of Trustees has voted to resume the Annual Meeting to address the remaining issue that was tabled: the approval of funds to replace the aging oil burner.

The motion as presented is:

Motion to Approve: Allow the Board of Trustees to use up to \$37,000 from a combination of existing savings and the endowment fund, which is \$ 159,281 as of the beginning of June, to replace the current oil burner system with a newer, more highly efficient oil burner system
