Happy Friday!

I came across a quote the late politician and civil rights champion John Lewis this week. It spoke to me very strongly about our spiritual mandate at this time. As we hold outward advocacy and action as a dear piece of our religious community, I can't emphasize enough that maintaining our spiritual heath and commitment to hope, love, justice, right relationship, kindness and optimism is not only a spiritual mandate but one of the highest forms of activism. Says John Lewis:

Do not get lost in a sea of despair.

Do not become bitter or hostile.

Be hopeful; be optimistic.

Never, ever be afraid to make some noise and get in good trouble, necessary trouble. We will find a way to make a way out of no way.

It is his most famous quote. They are his legacy words. And it captures the heart of our religion to the very core. It marries our spirit to the call to right action, in gentle ways. Unitarian Universalism draws on wisdom of all sources and some that we emphasize more than others are those that advocate liberation through nonviolent resistance, Resistance. Resistance to the chaos and despair that is being propagated to discourse and disempower us. I am taking this church time, summer time pace to gird my loins so to speak.
