Coming back to where we all belong!

I will be adding a bit of a commissioning of the new committees and volunteers and frankly all of you as beloved members of our community to the call of showing up with open hearts and hands for the year ahead! The children will be joining us for the water communion and we will use their closing when we extinguish our chalice. We will have a new RE person to introduce and a new filmer as well. Mostly it will be wonderful to see you in the pews, listen to the organ and to the choir and enjoy your company!

The overarching theme for the year is community. Building, sustaining, and fostering beloved community. The theme for the month is Building Belonging. Special Music for September:

9/14 The UUCSB Pick Up Choir – Our choir, directed by Ellie Rolnick, will offer special music and often supports the congregational singing. Make a joyful noise with us!

9/21 Patrick Freeman – Patrick was born in Fort Kent, Maine in 1948. He lived with foster care from the ages 3 to 18. He had some music lessons when he was young but at about the age of 9 he did not have a piano at the house so had to discontinue the lessons. Around age 20 he had private music lessons for about a year. In his late twenties he moved to Bangor and found employment selling organs, receiving free music lessons from the owner for a year. He continued to play organs and became self-taught. Patrick graduated from UMaine in 1976 with a teaching degree. After several teaching and other jobs



he settled in Portland working at Maine Medical Center for 16 years. He continued playing the organ and keyboard during those times. He retired from MMC in 2013 and started playing music in Nursing Homes throughout Southern Maine. He usually plays music from way back in early 1900 to the present day. He has started a music recording studio in his apartment which continues to be a learning process. Patrick says "I enjoy playing music. I have been playing music by ear for many years. I guess that is a God gift."

A2S... Aging to Saging

Group will meet once or twice a month October -May with a celebration in June. It will meet once a month, formally structured and organized by Rev. Lori. There is an invitation for group to meet informally another time (or weekly) during month for informal coffees or luncheons as a wisdom or sharing circle or general social meeting.

9:30-11:30am on 2nd Wednesdays starting October 8

The first meeting will be covenanting together, setting ritual and expectations is our first meeting, going over schedules, working out if it is a closed group or open group and whether there should be additional meetings during the month (soul collage, embodied movement, sound bathing, creating and enjoying ritual and ceremony together personal storying telling) considering the tasks of aging (letting go, dealing with grief, choosing a legacy for yourself and the church). Could be as formal or casual as you like. Timing would allow for coffee, breakfast or lunch together, before or after.

Here is the outline that came to me:

- October...naming the group and covenanting together
- November...book discussion..On the Brink of Everything, Parker Palmer
- December...Soul Collaging
- January....Storytelling and Writing Your Story as a Spiritual Practice
- February...From Doing to Being authentic movement/meditation and other spiritual practices
- MarchTruth and Forgiveness...letter writing ...the 5 things
- April....choosing a legacy...your own and for the church...brainstorming, vision board making or just talking
- May...mapping a way forward together...what will we continue into the next year, what feels completed
- June....ceremony/ritual...saying/sovereign or just dancing by the moonlight and fire pit.

Futures Committee... coming soon!

UUCSB is forming a Futures Committee or really more of a think tank. *Dreamstorming* is my word for this. This is not a short term project but an ongoing dialogue. One that involves commitment to discernment of how we translate our principles and values into the world around us. Futures is a self reflective discernment group that seeks to integrate the church's spirituality into looking outward and forward with missional eyes. In essence, the group creates a mind map of the impact they would like the church to have on the community and the world. This group provides a unique opportunity for the congregation to actively engage in creating a legacy that involves both the hopes and dreams of our long timers with the new ideas and knowledge of those just joining us. Drawing on the history, experiences, and hopes of our long time members as well as the passions and new ideas of our new members, the Futures does a number of things to help orient a congregation for the next leg of their growth.

The group takes spiritual inventory of the community. Revisits mission, visions, values, covenants, and commitments. The group assesses physical, financial, and personnel assets to consider how the church can plan for succession and growth for its next phase. It inventories passions and energy to help discern where the community is and focus their collective energy living out their shared values and assets.

The group also involves the larger community in their inventorying and data gathering. They will eventually convene folks from the town, chambers of commerce, local non profits, local historians, schools, etc to consider the needs of the community and how we are positioned to respond. We can *dreamstorm* how our assets can support the local community in what it needs and in support of those who are doing the work.

The structure and commitment will be determined by those who gather. The group could be a "standing group" that meets monthly, or an informal drop-in group that meets on a quarterly basis with some research and sharing of information in between. The group could decide to meet for a year or two and present results at annual meetings, publish learnings in the newsletter and annual report, or just report out semi-annually at forums.

Futures Committee... coming soon!

It will be convened by Rev. Lori, drawing on some of the elements of more formal futures committees and adapted to our community's wants and needs for discernment. She will concurrently be meeting with clergy groups and ED's of community groups and city officials to gather data and present. (She has begun to do this already...and will integrate those organizations into our share the plates.)

The group will meet initially on September 28th after church in the parlor and discuss the particulars of the group. Composition, goals, meeting times and frequency. Initial thoughts are that the church will do some internal work in the fall and then invite some community partners in the winter or spring for additional data gathering to integrate into our discernment together.
